112 Minutes of the Ordinary Meeting of Full Council held on 19 November 2020

The Minutes of the Ordinary Meeting of Full Council held on 19 November 2020 were received and approved by Council.

113 Transport for Wales: Gelynis Bridge and Construction Compound at Morganstown

The Chair reported on correspondence received from Transport for Wales and from Mark Drakeford MS in relation to the plans for Gelynis Bridge and the construction compound at Morganstown. Planning Committee have sent a list of questions to Transport for Wales requesting further information to assist the Council in forming a view on the plans. A further meeting with Transport for Wales will be arranged for Planning Committee.

The Chair reported on the results of the RMCC survey of local residents' views on the Transport for Wales plans. Contact has also been made with Radyr Rangers and Pugh's Garden Centre who are also affected by the plans.

Cllr Kieran Webster provided a report on a meeting of Morganstown residents held on 15 December to discuss concerns about the Transport for Wales plans and outlined the next steps that the residents group would be taking. Cllr Webster reported that the aim of the residents group would be to get the construction compound moved.

Cllr Rod McKerlich outlined the role of the planning and licensing process that would follow once Transport for Wales submit a formal planning application to Cardiff Council.

Following discussion, the Chair summarised the next steps:

- The concerns of Morganstown residents are an important consideration for the Community Council. The impact on Radyr Rangers will also be an issue for the Community Council to take into account.
- The Community Council does not yet have a full understanding of the Transport for Wales plans and more research is needed before Council can come to a view.
- Following further work and a meeting with Transport for Wales, Planning Committee will report back to Full Council in the New Year.
- Planning Committee will look out for any planning application that is made by Transport for Wales to Cardiff Council that sets out final proposals for Gelynis Bridge and the compounds.

114 Grant Application – Radyr & Morganstown Good Neighbours

Members received and discussed an application from the Parish of Radyr, along with a paper prepared by the Chair, for a grant to establish Radyr & Morganstown Good Neighbours as a charitable incorporated organisation to provide activities and support for vulnerable and isolated members of the community.

RESOLVED: Council agreed to award a grant of £5,000 to Radyr & Morganstown Good Neighbours to be used for the purposes set out in the application. The grant will fund activities for the first six months of the Radyr & Morganstown Good Neighbours project. Before the six months is completed, the Community Council will review progress on establishing the organisation and identifying needs in the community and will then reach a decision on continued support for the project. Council agreed that the £5,000 grant would be made available when the following conditions are met:

- The Constitution for Radyr & Morganstown Good Neighbours is adopted.
- The Trustees are appointed.
- A bank account in the name of Radyr & Morganstown Good Neighbours is opened.

The Community Council will nominate a Trustee once further information is available on likely arrangements for Trustee meetings.

This Grant has been awarded using the power to promote wellbeing (Local Government Act 2000 and Local Government (Wales) Measure 2011).
